RULES FOR ELECTRONIC Sic Bo

The rules for Electronic Sic Bo at this casino, set out below, are our commitment to the players in ensuring that the gambling we offer is 'Fair and Open'. Any complaints or disputes should be brought to the immediate attention of Venue Management for resolution.

The game of Sic Bo offers players a single-roll dice game of chance. The objective of this casino game is to roll a chosen combination (or combinations) of dice in a single roll. There are various bets available and all bets must be placed before hitting the "Roll" button.

Players may place as many bets as they like, except with opposing bets (Even/Odd or Big/Small).

All possible Sic Bo bets can be divided into two groups:

- Main bets, which are a part of every Sic Bo game, and
- Additional bets, which may be added to the main bets.

SIC BO BETS Main Bets

Three Dice Total

Here the player bets that a specific three-dice sum ranging from 4 to 17 will be rolled. The totals of triples are excluded from this bet, since they are a part of the Triple Bets, and the player loses if a triple is rolled. For example, if three ones, three fives, three fours, etc. are rolled, the bet loses. The player can place chips on one or more betting positions.

- Win on 4 or 17 pays out **50 X bet**
- Win on 5 or 16 pays out **18 X bet**
- Win on 6 or 15 pays out **14 X bet**
- Win on 7 or 14 pays out **12 X bet**
- Win on 8 or 13 pays out **8 X bet**
- Win on 9 or 12 pays out **6 X bet**
- Win on 10 or 11 pays out **6 X bet**

Small and Big Bet

The Small and Big bet are two separate bets. They are Three Dice Totals divided into a group of “small” totals (totals ranging from 4 to 10) and “big” totals (totals ranging from 11 to 17). Triples are excluded from this bet.

- **SMALL** or **BIG** numbers pays out **1 X bet**

Triple Bet

With this bet, the player wagers that all three dice will show the same number. They may bet on a specific triple (e.g. three sixes) or on Any Triple. The latter is a bet that any three identical numbers will be rolled.

Bets on a specific triple can be placed on more than one betting field.

- A winning bet on a specific **Triple** pays **150 X bet**
- A winning bet on Any **Triple** pays **24 X bet**

Double Bet

The bet wins if the same two numbers appear on two of the three dice and loses if a triple occurs. A Double Bet must not be mixed with a Pair Bet. The player can place their bets on as many doubles as they like.

- A winning bet on a specific **Double** pays out **8 x bet**

Number Bet

Just as the name implies, this is a bet that a certain number will be rolled on any of the dice. Bets can be placed on one or more betting positions.

If the certain chosen number that is bet upon appears:

- On one die pays out **1 X bet**
- On two dice pays out **2 X bet**
- On three dice pays out **3 X bet**

Pair Bet

The player may also bet on certain numbers to appear on two of the three dice, which is considered a pair. A pair may be formed by a different set of non-matching numbers, e.g. 3 and 5.

- **Pair** pays out **5 X bet**

Additional Bets (if enabled)

Four Number Combination Bet

The bet wins if three of the four chosen numbers appear on the dice.

- **Four number combination** pays **7 X bet**

Even and Odd Bet

The Even and Odd bet is simple since the player only must decide whether to wager on an odd or even outcome of the dice roll. The bet is lost if triples are rolled.

- **EVEN** and **ODD** numbers pay out **1 X bet**

A PLAYER'S GUIDE TO THE HOUSE EDGE

House Edge is a measure of how much the House expects to win, expressed as a percentage of the player's wager. For example, in a wager with a House Edge of five percent the player will lose on average over time, £5 for every £100 wagered. House Edges vary by region, casino and game. In some games, player betting or skills decisions can affect the Edge, but it's important to keep in mind that the House always has some advantage against the typical player.

House edge range is 2.78 – 47.22%
